Brown County United Way serves as the anchor partner and co-investor to the Community Schools Initiative with Green Bay Area Public Schools. Brown County United Way, in collaboration with more than 20 Brown County nonprofit agencies, has created an innovative new service called the HubCAP (Community Access Partnership). The HubCAP is designed to help people in Brown County better access the services they need to achieve stability in their lives.

The first campaign is chaired by Nate Rosenberg and raises \$17,582.
